Cranes Flock to Westminster!

Pictured below and to the left is a new air conditioning condenser being hoisted into position on the west side of the building on Thursday, January 22. Last year, one of our eight air conditioning condensers failed and then froze during the brutal month of January 2014. It will take about two weeks for the contractor to make the necessary repairs. Final testing will begin when the weather becomes warm enough to turn on the air conditioning system. The \$35,000 repair cost will be handled mostly by the insurance we carry for the breakdown of major mechanical equipment.

Last Thursday, another crane, pictured below and to the right, hoisted roofing materials up to the Educational Wing roof. The old roofing material on the Educational Wing is being removed and a new waterproofing membrane is being installed. The old roofing material is over 20 years old has been patched

more than 44 times. As of today, the repairs are about fourty percent completed but snow has temporarily stopped the re-roof progress. When the new roofing material is installed, some of the water-damaged areas inside the building will be repaired.



All Things Considered

This Sunday, February 15, we will welcome a panel of distinguished guests, who will speak about the circumstances and experiences of the civil rights movement while Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was alive and the following years of desegregation. This panel discussion will be moderated by Kay Henderson and will feature H. Milton Cole-Duval, an Episcopal priest at St. Timothy's in West Des Moines, who is also a member of the WDM School Board; Des Moines NAACP past President and National Rep. Linda Carter-Lewis; Cowles Montessori Principal Udell Cason; Patrick Hall, who was a student in the Des Moines School District when the district was going through desegregation. Also on the panel will be Westminster member, Carrie Hall, who was involved with the Desegregation Steering Committee and also involved with racial justice on a national level.

On Sunday, February 22, a different panel will speak to the circumstances that exist today and how Dr. King's legacy continues to influence our country, in terms of racial and social justice. Join us on February 22, as we welcome lowa House Representative Ako Abdul-Samad, and a number of other guests who are actively involved in racial and social justice issues in the Des Moines area. They Get It...They Really Get It!

A leader in early childhood education once told me there is no point in trying to teach young children about God because they lack the comprehension skills to understand. I suppose it's obvious that I strongly disagree, considering my role as Director of Christian Education. Are young children capable of comprehending complex theological concepts? No, but are they capable of understanding and knowing that God loves them, knows them and hears them when they're praying? Without a doubt! I often hear from parents who share things that their children have said about their faith. Things they've learned at church. Yes, they actually think about God and have an active relationship with Jesus even after they leave church.

I'd like to share a few examples. On Wednesday nights, the children have spent significant time discovering ways to care for others. They learned how they can care for the elderly, for those experiencing homelessness and hunger, and for one another. They have had several opportunities to make a difference in the lives of those experiencing hunger, including their involvement in Backpack Buddies. Backpack Buddies is an important program at Westminster that provides nutritious food for elementary school children who do not have regular access to food when school is not in session. This is a valuable opportunity for our kids to help other kids right here in our own community. When our kids fill bags, they know they're really filling hungry tummies. We recently filled 700 bags in one Wednesday evening! The kids were so excited, because they understood that was 700 hungry tummies that would be fed because of their hard work!


I recently received an email from a parent of one of those children. Attached to the email was this picture, which was created at school for a Martin Luther King, Jr. lesson. This is the picture that my friend, Pierce, made. It says "I have (a) dream that all kids will have food." This drawing was done shortly after the evening filling Backpack Buddies. I'd say Pierce gets it!

Just last week, I walked into the four-year-old preschool classroom. I have lots of friends in that classroom, because many of them attend the optional Preschool KidPOWER that is offered every Tuesday. Several of the children were building a structure out of wooden blocks. I asked what they were building and they informed me that it was a

structure where their sea creatures could pray to Jesus! Wow, Jesus has become part of their play time. How cool is that?! I'd say those preschoolers get it!

I have so many more examples, but not much space, so I'll close with one final example. During KidPOWER, several weeks ago, we were talking about prayer. We talked about how God answers our prayers, and how sometimes it's not exactly the way we intended God to answer them. It's important for us to "pray without ceasing" and then trust that God hears our prayers and answers them in ways that we don't always understand. Alice shared about her grandfather who had been very ill over a year ago. She prayed that he wouldn't die. She shared with us that although he did pass away, she knows that God DID answer her prayers. You see, her grandmother was moved to write a book about him. Alice shared that she learned things about her grandfather after he died that she never knew when he was living. She credits God for inspiring her grandmother to write the book, which provided Alice a way of being able to keep her grandfather close to her heart forever. Alice definitely gets it!

I find it so gratifying to hear and witness these examples of children living their faith. As Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." Matthew 19:14.

SUNDAY MORNING

During severe weather, snowstorms, water failures, power outages, or ice storms, Sunday worship and other Sunday activities may be cancelled. If worship is cancelled, we will notify the local television stations, and we will update the Westminster website (westpres.org), the telephone answering system and our Facebook pages to reflect this change. If you are not sure call the office and hear the message.

WEEKDAY EVENTS

Weekday daytime church and community events (including the office and preschool) will be cancelled if the Des Moines Public Schools are cancelled. Please check any of the local TV stations (or their websites) for Des Moines Schools cancellation announcements. If you are not sure call the office and hear the message.

EVENING EVENTS

Since weather and road conditions may improve significantly by late afternoon, evening meetings may not always be cancelled even if Des Moines schools are closed. Or, if Des Moines Schools are open but weather conditions deteriorate later in the day, evening meetings may be cancelled. Please call the church office, 274-1534, or check the church's website or Facebook pages regarding the status of evening meetings or activities. If you are not sure call the office and hear the message.
